### Professor Chris Young elected 16th Master of St Edmund's College

The Governing Body of St Edmund's College has elected Professor Chris Young to be the next Master of the College. Succeeding Catherine Arnold OBE, whose five-year term concludes in September 2024, Chris will take up the post from 1 October 2024.

Chris Young is Professor of Modern and Medieval German Studies at the University of Cambridge and Head of the School of Arts and Humanities. He is also Director of the Cambridge DAAD Research Hub for German Studies, and founder and Director of the Cambridge-LMU Strategic Partnership, Cambridge's first institution-wide partnership with any university. He is both a medievalist and a prize-winning historian of modern sport. He is currently co-curating a major exhibition this summer at the Fitzwilliam Museum on the 1924 Paris Olympics (best known through the film 'Chariots of Fire') and serving on the German government's Historical Commission on the terrorist attack at the 1972 Olympics in Munich.

Professor Chris Young said of his appointment, "St Edmund's has a unique heritage and global vision within the Cambridge landscape. I am delighted to be able to continue the work of Catherine Arnold and her predecessors and look forward to serving the College and working with its Fellows and students in the next exciting phase of its development."




### St Edmund's Celebrates International Women's Day




### St Edmund's v Hughes Hall Supreme Court Moot Victory


Mike said:

### A New Research Book on Linguistics

Mr Eiichi Iwasaki, former Visiting Scholar of St Edmund's College, has published a new scholarly book, *Platonist Linguistics: Mathematical Foundations of Japanese and English Analysis*. Nagoya: Sankeisha Co., Ltd. (Dec 2023)

This work, his fifth sole-authored academic monograph, proposes a new linguistic theory through the analyses of a variety of thought-provoking language facts both in English and Japanese, encompassing copular sentences, as well as existential and possessive ones. The central thesis of this book is that some essential elements of human language are in fact the embodiment of mathematical functions; in other words, some linguistic elements such as "the", "there" (or "there's"), and "have" are themselves mathematical functions, a proposal that goes beyond the claim that they are just analysable mathematically. This theory is a descendant of Iwasaki's 2015 book, and is also distinct from Russell's 1905 theory of descriptions. Iwasaki's theoretical standing point is that linguistics, in a narrower sense, deals with mathematical objects (cf. Katz) that are lexicalised as linguistic expressions, rather than referents in a world. Overall, Iwasaki's approach combines new theoretical proposals with conscientious close analysis of linguistic facts. His book aims to shape linguistic research in coming years, and to stand as an important contribution to linguistics and the philosophy of language.

Mr Iwasaki's book has now been donated to St Edmund's College Library, and he says that he is delighted and honored that his book is now in the library located in the Luzzio Building, named after the former Master, whom he respects enormously. Mr Iwasaki is also grateful to those who kindly cooperated with his research, in particular Dr Chris Cummins at the University of Edinburgh who is an alumnus of Trinity College Cambridge and a noted researcher in experimental pragmatics and semantics, Dr Iren Waller, a Japanese classical literature scholar holding a PhD from Yale University, and President Shunsuke Kimata of Sankeisha Co., Ltd., the publisher of the book.
